**1. ADJUTANT GENERAL'S SCHOOL.**—The following information is furnished for the guidance of officers and commanding officers of enlisted personnel ordered to attend courses at the Adjutant General's School:

1. Government quarters for officers selected will be provided at Fort Washington, Maryland, and an officers' mess is in operation. No quarters are available for dependents on the post. Accommodations in the vicinity, including Arlington, Alexandria, and Washington, are both scarce and expensive. There will be little opportunity for dependents to visit the officers while they are pursuing the courses. Orders detailing students to attend courses will state specifically that dependents will not be authorized to accompany students. Under no circumstances will dogs or other pets be brought to the post.

2. Prior to departure from home stations, officers should familiarize themselves with the provisions of AR 605-180 relative to the allowable travel time and use of privately owned transportation on temporary change of station.

3. Officers and enlisted students should arrive at Union Station, Washington, D. C., during daylight hours. Students will be met in the South Concourse, Union Station, Washington, D. C., on dates set for reporting by representative of the Adjutant General's School who will arrange for transportation of personnel and baggage to the post. Each student should carry on his or her person copies of orders and other records. Undue delay in registration and identification is frequently occasioned by students who place such orders and records in checkable baggage.

4. The uniform for officers will be wool from 1 October to 15 May. Light shade (pink) slacks are worn for ceremonies. Coats must be worn after retreat and on Sundays and holidays during the period when the wool uniform is prescribed. At least one pair of fatigues and leggings should be brought, as well as other clothing and equipment for inclement weather and recreation.

5. Bed linen is not available for issue at the Adjutant General's School, and officers must provide their own. Minimum of three sheets and two pillowcases is necessary.

6. In all cases where enlisted personnel are ordered to return to their proper station upon completion of the course of instruction, transportation officers at home stations should provide such personnel with necessary transportation and meals for the round trip. Responsible commanders should promptly advise the Commandant, the Adjutant General's School, concerning changes in the location of units who have enlisted personnel attending the school in order to facilitate transportation to new stations.

7. In view of the heavy demands on transportation facilities leaving Washington, D. C., and the necessity of securing reservations in advance, it is essential that all travel performed by military personnel be carefully planned and coordinated.
